

PPP's Sister Pauline meets Pope Francis

On August 27th, Sister Pauline, PPP's founder, and her service dog, Pax left for Rome to meet the Pope. Sister Pauline was instrumental in getting their program off the ground. As you may recall, Pax polished his service dog skills here at PPP last year after being raised in a prison dog program in Wisconsin.

Sister Pauline visited the Vatican with the director of the prison dog programs in Argentina for which, like PPP, she was instrumental in the start-up. Here is the story in her own words:

"On September 4th the Holy Father gave me a kiss on the cheek with Pax by my side. What a great feeling it was to be received with such love and kindness and to give a talk about my work in prisons. Look where all this lead me, to the Vatican with a kiss from the Holy Father. What a great feeling that was. Pax was so good.

Thanks to Pax's charm, he drew in the Vatican police who wanted to know all about the prison dog

programs. They saw I was in pain and wanted to help me... so we had a wonderful tour of the Vatican gardens by car. The car stopped by the newly planted "peace" olive tree. Allowed to get out of the car to take pictures, I made sure that Pax would not water the one and only tree in this Peace Park that looked out to Saint Peters Basilica. At the Vatican it was great that everyone knew what Pax's name meant. It means Peace in Latin."

A note from the director

PPP has had some big changes. You may recall from past newsletters that we had some funding cuts from the United Way of Pierce County as well as the addition of utility expenses from the DOC that had once been in-kind donations. As a result, PPP had to evaluate our programs and processes to determine the effectiveness of our operations. Consequently, we decided to close operations at Mission Creek in Belfair at the end of June. While at Mission Creek, PPP provided basic pet care classes to over 70 women. Of these, 42 completed the basic dog obedience classes – 21 of whom moved on to become primary or secondary dog handlers. Although we provided much needed programming to the women, offender turnover rate (due to release and mandatory programming) and the inability to house more than 5 dogs at a time at Mission Creek ultimately lead to the board's decision that we needed to end the program at Mission Creek so that we can focus our efforts on growing our program in Gig Harbor. We are proud of our efforts at Mission Creek and we know that the staff and inmates there miss our program and the dogs.

Another big change for us was losing 2 long-time staff. First, Mollyrose Sommer, our program assistant left at the beginning of June. Mollyrose came to PPP in March of 2007. She was the glue that held all of the programs together from coordinating volunteers and outreach booths to organizing Bark and Bid and our service dog team training and graduation. Molly

had been commuting from South Seattle for nearly 2 years. She and her husband Ryan purchased a new home in North Seattle last spring so we knew the time was coming that the commute would be too much. Mollyrose is now working at a vet hospital as a client liaison but is still volunteering her time to help PPP.



Teresa Crutchfield started with PPP in 1996 as the correctional officer assigned by DOC. When Teresa retired from the DOC in 2013, PPP hired her to work as a part-time office assistant. Teresa helped us with Bark and Bid, donor relations, bookkeeping and in the boarding and grooming office. Last year, Teresa and her husband bought property in Belize.

Once construction began on her tropical home this spring, Teresa was ready to head to the sunshine. Thank you Teresa for 18 years of service to PPP!

Grooming update by Ruth Bloch

We have four new groomers in **training!** Each started out, as all groomers in training do, learning to properly handle all shapes and sizes of dogs. Each dog comes with it's own very individual personality and requires different types of love! Then it's on to proper shampooing techniques, blow drying, nail

clipping, ear cleaning and brushing. Everyone is doing so well!

The women have now advanced to creating simple styles and perfecting their scissoring techniques. Styling a moving, living being isn't easy but everyone is hard at work and we are so proud of them! The dogs love them, too!

In the next couple of months, each woman will be tested by a certifier from the International Professional Groomers Association. Through IPG, they will receive a certificate in Salon Details. This provides them with the ability to shine when entering the work force as new pet groomers. It also offers prospective employers the chance to hire women who are certified and professionally trained in the field they have chosen.

The next step in the certification process will be mastering the individual breed groups. Stay tuned, we'll keep you posted as the women continue their progression into becoming Certified Dog Groomers!


Paisley –
